

Resolution of the Executive Committee, Turin, Italy 31 March to 4 April 2019

"Assessing priority of Design applications"

FICPI, the International Federation of Intellectual Property Attorneys, broadly representative of the free profession throughout the world, assembled at its Executive Committee held in Turin, Italy, 31 March to 4 April 2019, passed the following Resolution:

Considering that the Paris Convention provides the "Priority Application Right" for designs which allows an applicant to file a subsequent application in other jurisdictions within six months claiming the date of filing of the first application,

Noting that requirements and practices for representations in Design applications vary significantly across jurisdictions,

Recognising that the Priority Application Right for designs may be vital for applicants wishing to protect designs across multiple jurisdictions,

Noting with concern that although the majority of jurisdictions do not require identical representations to be filed in both the first and subsequent applications for a valid priority claim, there are some jurisdictions which take this approach,

Urges all jurisdictions to adopt a standard for assessing priority based on whether the subsequently filed design is substantially disclosed in the first application, not whether the representations are identical.
