

## Resolution of the Executive Committee, Kyoto, Japan 6-10 April 2014

## "Sequence Listing"

**FICPI**, the International Federation of Intellectual Property Attorneys, broadly representative of the free profession throughout the world, assembled at its Executive Committee held in Kyoto, Japan, 6-10 April 2014, passed the following Resolution:

**Recognising** that inventions in the biotechnology field frequently require the filing of a nucleic acid and/or amino acid sequence listing together with a patent application;

**Further recognising** that such sequence listings, by their own nature, may be extremely large in size;

**Noting** that most patent offices require the sequence listings to be filed in electronic form so that they can be easily accessed and searched;

**Further noting** that certain patent offices still impose on patent applicants a page-based fee for such sequence listings, despite the fact that the sequence listing is only useful in an electronic form;

Observing that this causes a high expense for patent applicants in the biotechnology field;

**Further acknowledging** that the majority of patent offices, without requiring any additional fee, electronically publish the sequence listings or at least make them available to the public through their web sites;

**Urges** patent offices requiring sequence listings to be filed in electronic form, to refrain from imposing on patent applicants a page-based fee for these listings.
