

## Resolution of the Executive Committee, Rome, 6-9 November 2011

## "Technically Qualified Judges in the First Instance of the Unified Patent Court"

**FICPI**, the International Federation of Intellectual Property Attorneys, broadly representative of the free profession throughout the world, assembled at its Executive Committee held in Rome, Italy, from 6 to 9 November 2011, passed the following Resolution:

**OBSERVING** that the current draft for the Agreement on the Unified Patent Court (hereinafter "UPC Agreement") stipulates<sup>1</sup> that the panels of the first instances of the local and regional divisions shall sit in a composition of three legally qualified judges and only the central division shall sit in a composition of two legally qualified judges and one technically qualified judge when dealing with infringement and related issues;

**BELIEVING** that a high quality patent litigation system requires an appropriate understanding by the panel of the technical issues at stake already in the first instance;

**URGES** the authorities involved in drafting the final version of the UPC Agreement to ensure technical competence of the panel by providing that a technically qualified judge is present in any first instance panel in a local and regional division according to the UPC Agreement.
